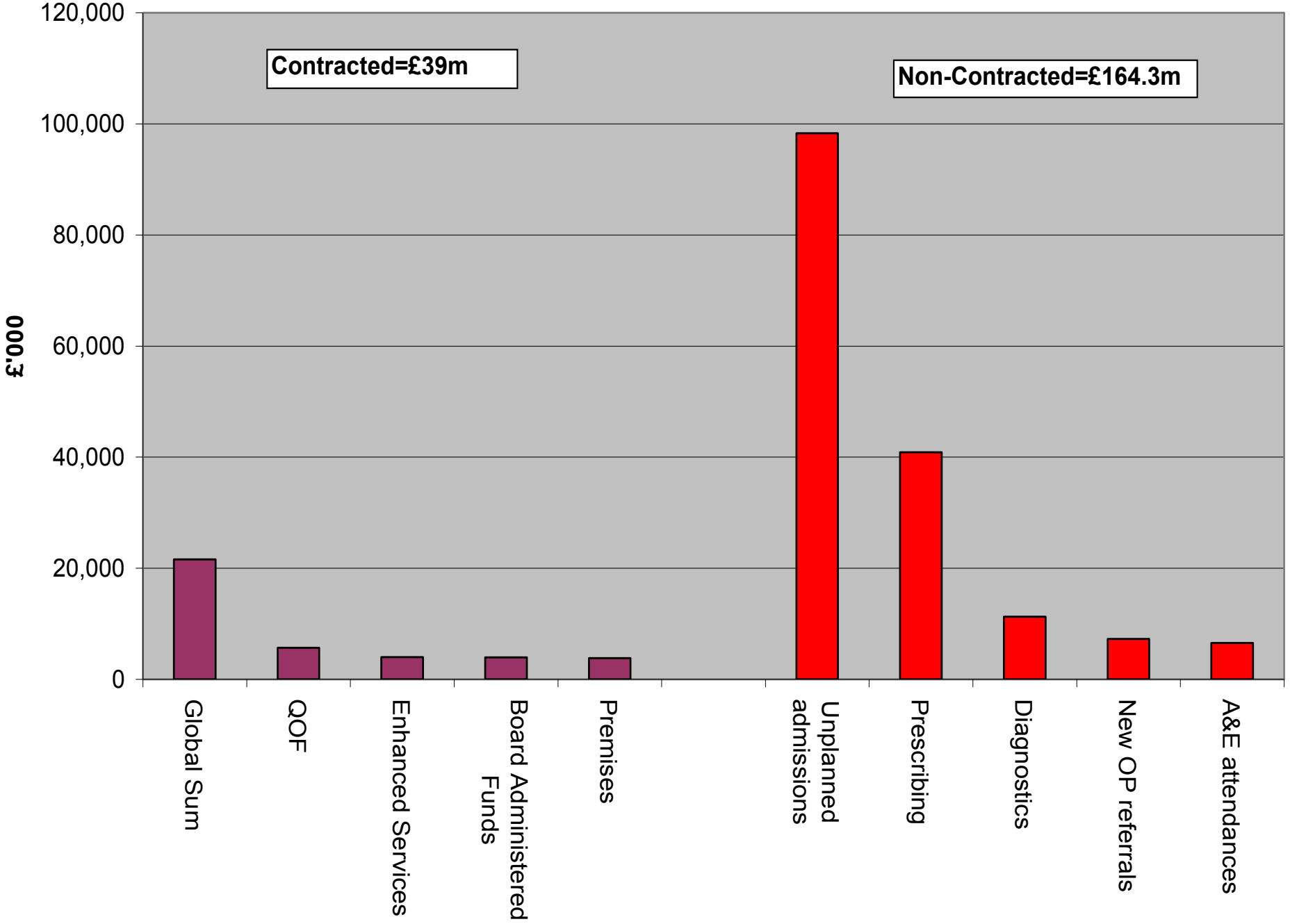

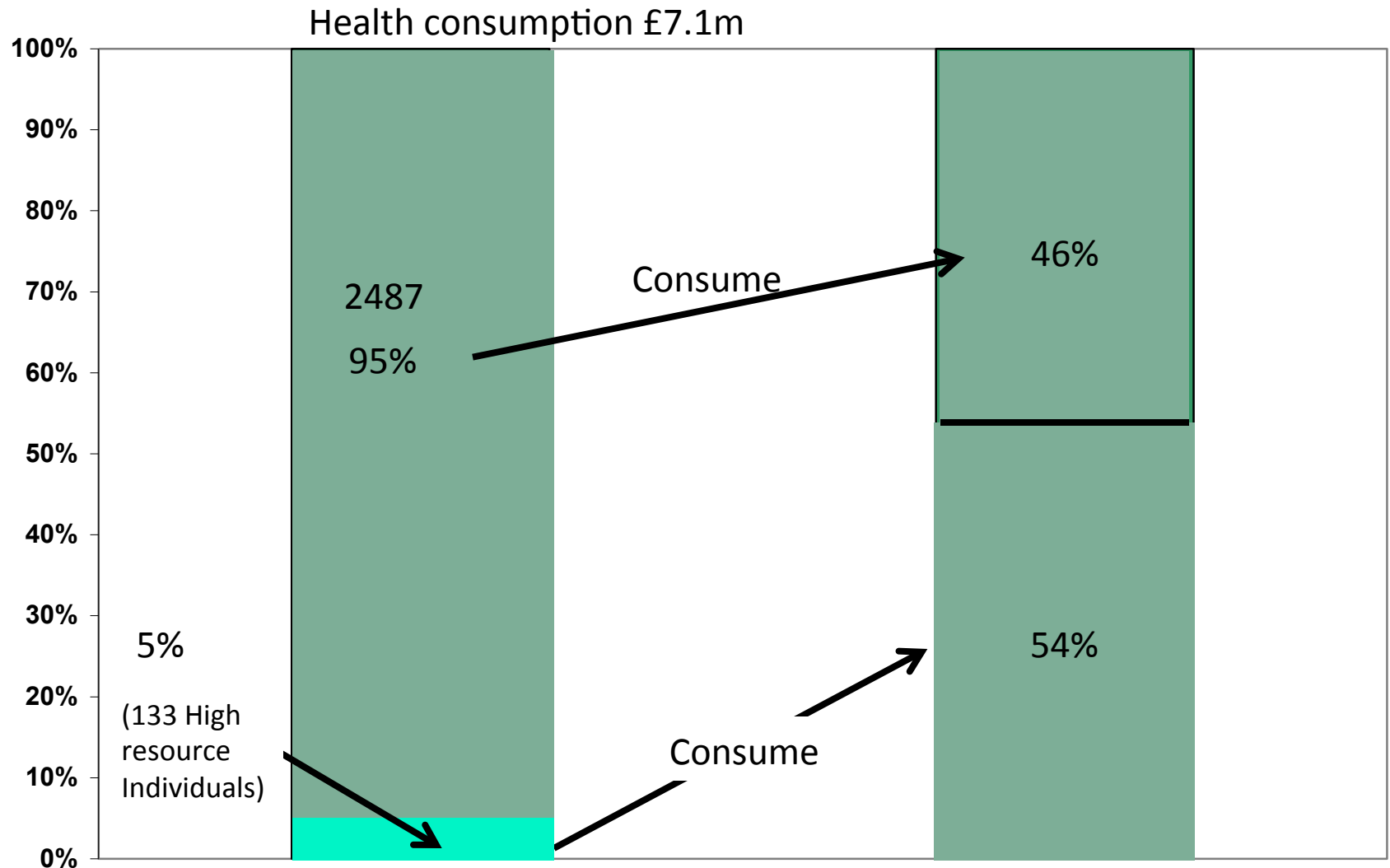


Tertiary Teaching Hospital

Calculating Perth and Kinross Council Locality outcomes that 98% of our 65 and over population are living safely at home

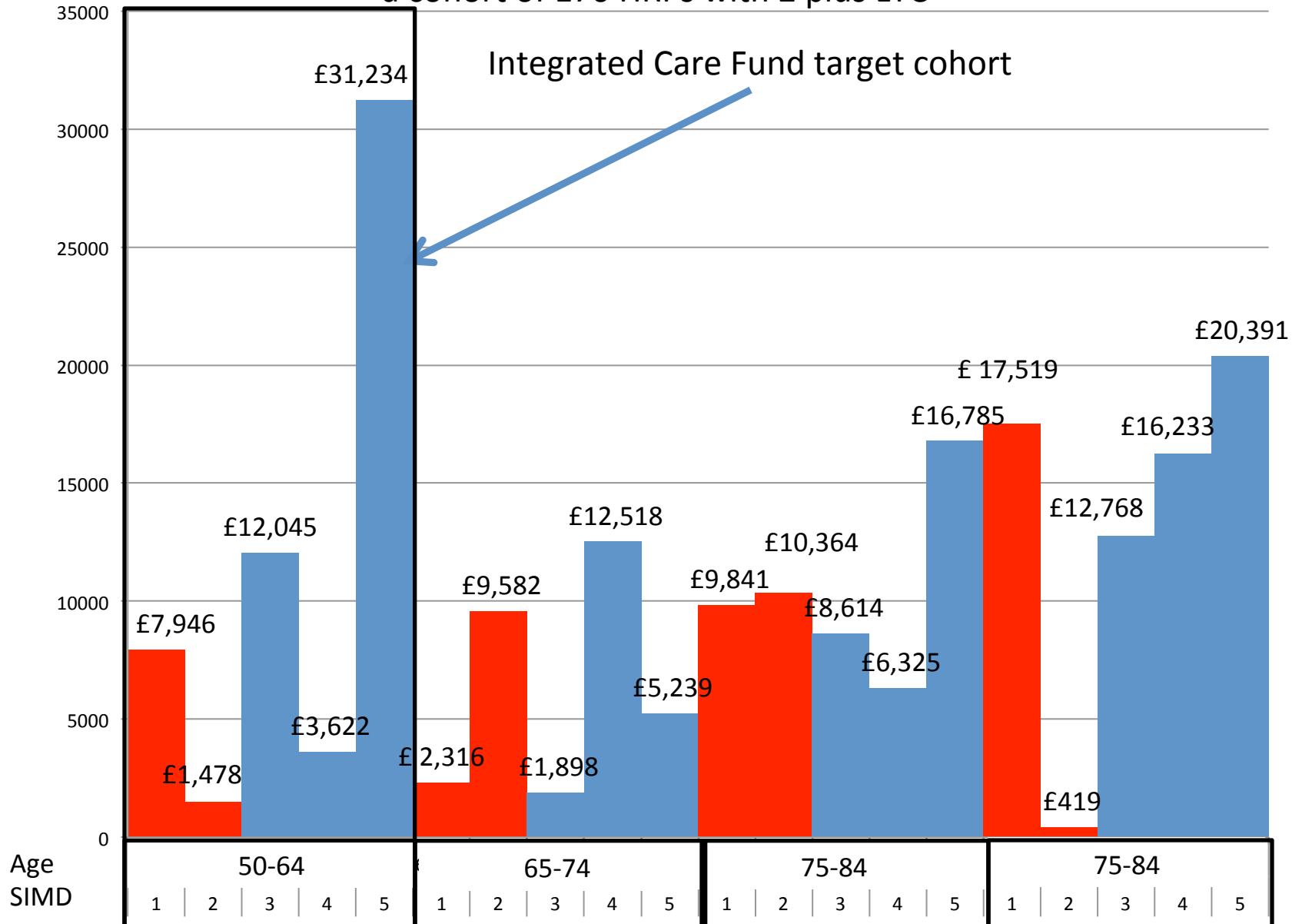

Above Perth City North and Perth City South both demonstrate similar higher levels of their populations in Care Homes likely due to proximity to services.

SIMD Perspective

High Resource Individuals £ per capita costs from one GP Practice
 -a cohort of 170 HRI's with 2 plus LTC



All patients offered 7 levels of care

- Self care**
- GMS**
- Complex home care packages including gold standard palliative care**
- Nursing home including gold standard palliative care**
- Extended generalist community care with beds; medical, nursing, psychiatry, midwifery**
- Disease specific consultant care**
- Lost**

The good news?

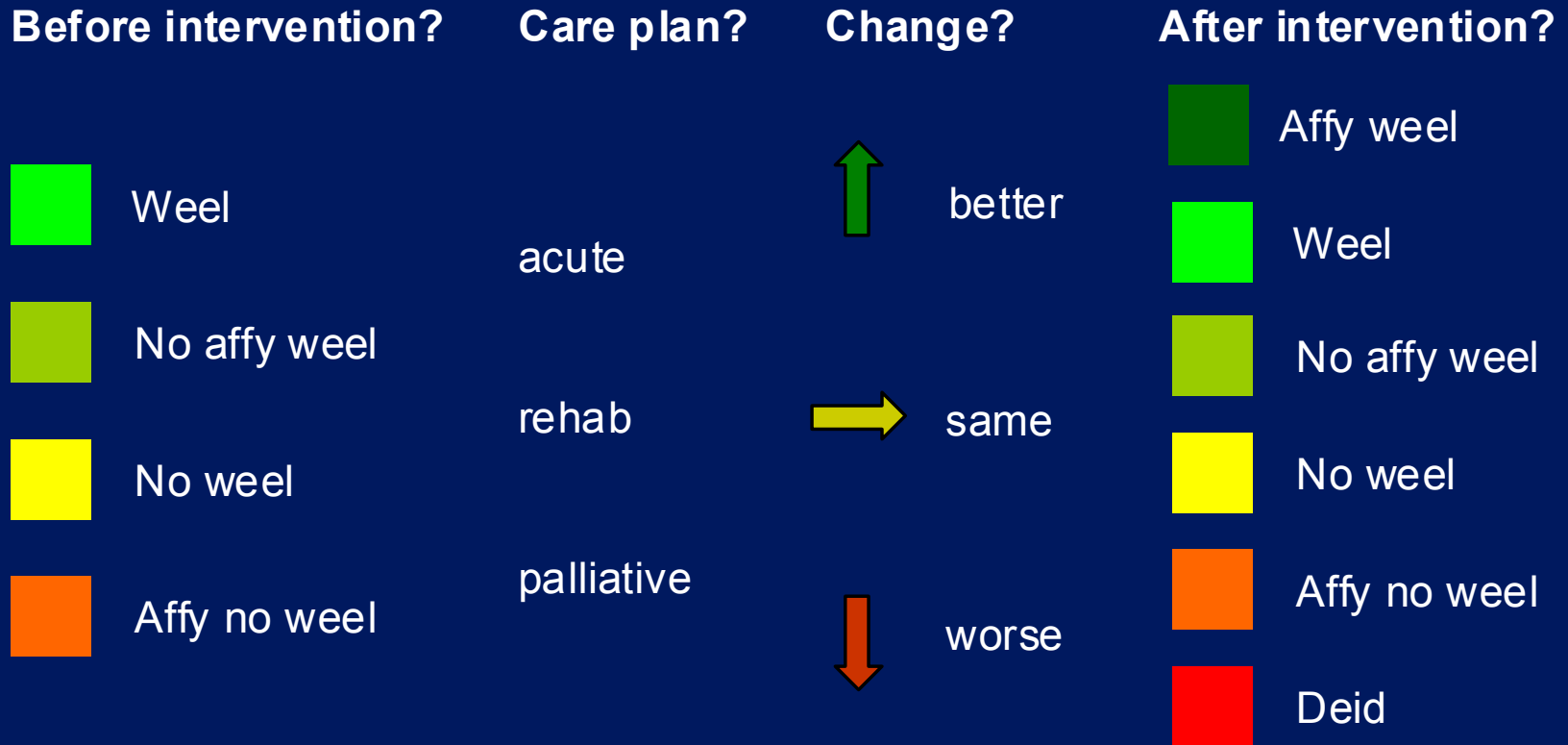
- ‘Looking after older people well is cheaper than looking after them badly’
